FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Erasmus+ Study Mobility?

Erasmus+ Study Mobility is an exchange program that allows students to spend part of their studies at a partner European higher education institution.

Who can apply for Erasmus+ Study Mobility?

Students who meet the following requirements may apply:

- Being enrolled in an **associate degree, bachelor's degree, master's degree, or doctoral program** at our university,
- Having **not previously spent a total of more than 12 months in Erasmus+ activities** at the same educational level,
- Meeting academic grade point average and language proficiency requirements.

In which year can I apply for Erasmus+ Study Mobility?

- **Undergraduate students** can apply for study mobility **no later than their third year.**
- Applications are made **for the following academic year.**
- Students can apply in their third year and benefit from Erasmus+ study mobility in their **fourth year.**

Applications for student mobility cannot be submitted in the final year of university.

When does the application period open?

Erasmus+ Study Mobility applications **open in February each year.**

Our university's Erasmus+ Office will announce the exact dates.

How to apply?

Applications are only accepted online through **TurnaPortal**. Applications submitted in person, via email, or through any other platform **will not be accepted**. You must also upload your CV in Europass format and your Istanbul Aydın University Transcript obtained from the official e-government system (UBIS screenshots will not be accepted). You can upload your TOEFL scores from the last two years or your YDS/YÖKDİL scores from the last five years to the TOEFL/YDS section (If you have any of them). If you do not have a TOEFL/YDS/YÖKDİL score, please click the box "I will participate in the language exam organized by the university".

How do I find the university I want to attend for my study mobility program?

What is the required academic grade point average (GPA) at our university?

Minimum GPA requirements applied at our university:

- **Associate and undergraduate students:** Minimum GPA of 2.20 / 4.00
- **Master's and doctoral students:** Minimum GPA of 2.50 / 4.00

Applications from students who do not meet this requirement will not be considered.

I have a course I need to retake; can I still participate in the Erasmus program?

Yes. **Having failed courses is not an obstacle to participating in the Erasmus+ Study Mobility program.**

The primary criterion used in the evaluation is the overall grade point average (CGPA).

What are the language proficiency requirements?

The minimum language level required for Erasmus+ Learning Mobility at our university is B1.

Language proficiency can be documented in the following ways:

- Erasmus foreign language exam conducted by our university
- Foreign language exams with national or international validity

Which foreign language exams are accepted, and what is their validity period?

The following exam results are accepted at our university:

- **TOEFL:** Must have been taken within the last **2 years**.
- **YDS / YÖKDİL (e-exams included):** Must have been taken within the last **5 years**.

The results documents for these exams can be uploaded to the TurnaPortal system during the application process.

- The selection score is calculated according to the following criteria:
- **Academic grade point average (CGPA):** 50%

- **Foreign language score: %50**

The positive and negative points specified in the Erasmus+ Application Handbook are also applied.

What are the minimum requirements I need to meet to apply?

- For associate and bachelor's degree students, having a minimum GPA of 2.20/4.00 is required.
- For graduate and doctoral students, a minimum GPA of 2.50/4.00 is required.
- Taking the Foreign Language Exam on the specified date.
- Having a sufficient number of ECTS credits for learning mobility (60 ECTS for one academic year),
- Being a full-time enrolled student and not being in a graduation status during the semester in which the Erasmus study program will take place,
- If the student has already benefited from higher education mobility activities during the Erasmus+ and Lifelong Learning (LLP) periods within their current level of study, the total duration of the new activity must not exceed 12 months.
- Students who have frozen their enrollment cannot benefit from mobility programs.
- Students enrolled in a double major program can only apply for mobility in one major program during the same application period.
- Students in preparatory programs, scientific preparation programs, second-year associate degree programs, fourth-year bachelor's degree programs, and graduates are not eligible to participate in learning mobility activities.

Will my score decrease if I have previously participated in the Erasmus program?

- Students who have previously participated in **Erasmus+ study or traineeship mobility** will have **-10 points** deducted from their selection score.
- However, the **-10 point deduction** does not apply to **BIP, short-term doctoral mobility, and similar short-term activities**.

Can I apply for more than one Erasmus mobility program at the same time?

Yes. Students can apply for more than one Erasmus mobility program in the same call period. If students are selected for more than one mobility program, **-10 points will be applied for applications other than their preferred mobility type**.

I have a green passport, do I need a visa?

Yes, a Green Passport only allows tourist travel of less than 90 days. You need a visa to stay for the duration of your studies.

Can I travel to another country during my Erasmus+ studies?

You can travel as long as your trip does not exceed 7 days. However, trips longer than 7 days will be detected by entry and exit stamps upon submission of return documents, and a reduction in your grant may occur.

Can I work while doing Erasmus?

The "work permit" regulations of the countries you visit under the Erasmus+ program vary. To obtain detailed and accurate information on this matter, you should read the relevant country's regulations. This way, you can access the most up-to-date and accurate information.

What criteria should I use to choose my university for the Erasmus Study Mobility program?

In the study mobility application, you can choose a maximum of 3 universities that your department has an agreement with (the number of countries/universities with which each department has an agreement varies; if there are not 3 universities to choose from in the system, fewer universities can be selected).

Since students will not be able to change their preferences later, we advise Istanbul Aydın University (IAU) students who are applying to pay attention to the university's language of instruction and the extent to which the courses match those offered at IAU when making their choices.

The first preference will be the first institution on the student's preference list. If the student's Erasmus success score is insufficient for the first institution, the other institutions they have chosen will be considered in order of priority.

If students cannot be placed in their preferred universities due to their scores or preferences, they may be placed in other universities by our Office (taking into account quotas and the application deadline).

Depending on their Erasmus success scores and the quotas of the universities, students may not be placed in any university.

Universities chosen should be expected to offer Erasmus+ students a total of at least 30 ECTS (credits). Master's and PhD students are advised to choose universities that provide credit for their theses and assign thesis advisors.

What is the duration of the Erasmus+ Study Mobility program?

Study mobility:

- **At least 2 months,**
- **Can be carried out for a maximum of 12 months.**

The total duration of study and traineeship mobility at the same educational level **cannot exceed 12 months.**

Will my KYK scholarship be cancelled during my Erasmus program?

Before participating in the Erasmus mobility program, you must contact KYK (Student Dormitory Institution) and inform them of your situation. If requested by the institution, our office can provide you with an application form confirming your eligibility as an Erasmus student. However, the final decision rests with KYK.

Is travel support available?

To help students with their travel expenses, the distance between the starting point and the location of the activity should be determined using the distance calculator provided by the European Commission (http://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/tools/distance_en.htm), and the travel grant should be calculated using the table below. The grant amount corresponding to the kilometer value obtained from the distance calculator is the round-trip amount in the table below, and this amount should not be multiplied by two.

What is Green Travel?

As a general rule, participants are expected to travel using low-emission vehicles for distances under 500 km.

Green travel refers to travel using low-carbon emission public transportation. Bus, train, and shared car use are all included in green travel. To receive green travel support, green transportation must be used for both the outward and return journeys, and more than half of the entire trip must be completed using green vehicles. Documents and invoices showing the start and end points of the trip are kept in the participant's file.

What is a grant? How can I be qualified?

The grant is financial assistance provided by the National Agency to our students who are eligible for Erasmus+ Mobility programs through our university. It is non-refundable, meaning it is not like a loan system. The amount of this monthly grant may vary depending on the country you are participating in. Whether you receive the grant will be determined based on your Erasmus+ Success Score. In the results table, our students will be indicated as primary- grant recipient and Reserve-non-grant recipient.

The status of reserve/non-funded students will be re-evaluated after the initial placements are completed, and students will be informed about any changes to their grant status. However,

non-funded students must sign the commitment form, accepting the risk of not receiving a grant. Otherwise, their scores will be reduced in the next application period.

How many ECTS credits do I need to take during my Erasmus program?

Within the scope of Erasmus+ Study Mobility:

- **It is mandatory to take 30 ECTS credits per semester.**

The ECTS credit load is clearly stated in the Learning Agreement.

What happens if I can't find an exact course match at the university I want to attend?

The course content does not have to be exactly the same. What matters is that the content and learning outcomes of the courses are deemed appropriate by your department.

Will the courses I took at the university I attended be credited?

Yes. Courses taken under the Learning Agreement prepared and signed before the mobility period are recognized at our university if successfully completed.

I'm in my final year of associate degree programs; can I apply for Erasmus?

You can only apply for internship mobility in your final year. As long as you apply while you are still an active student, you can complete your internship within 12 months of graduation.

Is the Erasmus exam free of charge?

There are no fees for Erasmus applications and exams.

What is a Learning Agreement?

The Learning Agreement is a document that shows the courses the student will take at the host university and their equivalents in their own program. It is prepared before the mobility period begins.

What are the registration and tuition fees like during the Erasmus program?

Students remain enrolled at our university during the Erasmus period and pay tuition fees only to their home university.

What happens if I give up mobility?

Students who, after being selected, fail to participate in the mobility program without waiving their rights within the specified time frame will receive **-10 points** on their subsequent applications.

Is there priority for disadvantaged situations?

Additional grants are available for disadvantaged students, provided they upload their official documents to the Turnportal system during the application process.

Can I make changes after matching the courses?

You can make course changes within the first month of your learning mobility by submitting a Changes to Learning Agreement and a new Approval Form.

Do I need to know the language of the country I'm going to?

You don't have to, but it would be in your best interest to prepare before you go.

Will I be able to choose courses at my university while I'm on the Erasmus program?

No. During the Erasmus+ Study Mobility program, students take their courses at the host institution. You don't need to select your courses here.

Erasmus+ Internship Mobility

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who can apply for Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility?

Students who meet the following requirements may apply:

- Being enrolled in an **associate degree, bachelor's degree, master's degree, or doctoral program** at our university,
- **Being a full-time student,**
- Meeting academic grade point average and language proficiency requirements,
- Having **not previously spent a total of more than 12 months in Erasmus+ activities** at the same educational level,

Can students enrolled in preparatory programs, scientific preparation programs, or those who have suspended their studies apply?

- **Preparatory and scientific preparation** students are not eligible to apply for internship mobility.
- Students who have suspended their studies cannot do an internship during the frozen period; however, they can apply for it.

Can I do an Erasmus+ internship after graduation?

Yes. Provided you apply and are selected **before graduation**, you can benefit from the Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility program **within 12 months** following graduation.

When can applications be submitted?

Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility applications open every year in February.

Our university's Erasmus+ Office will announce the exact dates.

How to apply?

Applications can only be submitted online through TurnaPortal. Applications submitted in person, via email, or through any other system will not be accepted.

What is the academic grade point average (GPA) requirement?

Minimum GPA requirements applied at our university:

- **Associate and undergraduate students: Minimum 2.20 / 4.00**
- **Master's and doctoral students: Minimum GPA of 2.50 / 4.00**

I have a course I need to retake; can I still participate in the internship mobility program?

Yes. Having failed courses does not prevent participation in the Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility program. The main criterion for evaluation is the overall grade point average.

What are the language proficiency requirements?

The minimum language level for Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility is **B1 (at least 65 points)**. Language proficiency can be documented with foreign language exams conducted by our university or with accepted national/international exam results.

Which foreign language exams are accepted, and what is their validity period?

The following exam results are accepted at our university:

- **TOEFL:** Must have been taken within the last **2 years**.
- **YDS / YÖKDİL(e-exams included):** Must have been taken within the last **5 years**.

Can I apply for a traineeship mobility program without an acceptance letter?

No. **You cannot apply for a traineeship mobility program without an acceptance letter.**

Students who submit an acceptance letter during the application process will receive **+10 points**

What information should be included in the acceptance letter?

The following information is **mandatory** in the acceptance letter:

- It should be stated that the internship is within the scope of Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility,
- Internship start and end dates,
- The internship period must be **at least 2 months**.
- Internship topic or position,

Name and address of the institution, and signature/stamp of the authorized person.

Can I do my mandatory internship or workplacement through Erasmus?

Yes. Students who complete their mandatory internship under the Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility program will receive **+5 points**.

This must be documented with an **Approval Form** during the application process.

How long should the internship period be?

Erasmus+ Traineeship Mobility:

- **At least 2 months (60 days)**
- **It lasts for a maximum of 12 months.**

Activities lasting less than 60 days are not accepted.

Will my score decrease if I have previously participated in the Erasmus program?

- Students who have previously participated in Erasmus+ activities at the same educational level will receive **-10 points**.
- BIP, short-term doctoral and short-term mixed mobility programs **are not considered within this scope**.

Can I do an internship in the country I am a citizen of?

A penalty of **-10 points** will be applied for internship mobility completed in the country of citizenship.

How is the election score calculated?

- The selection score is calculated according to the following criteria:
- **Academic grade point average: 50%**
- **Foreign language score: 50%**

Positive and negative points are applied in accordance with the Erasmus+ Application Handbook and the announcement text.

What happens if I give up mobility?

Students who, after being selected, fail to participate in the internship mobility program within the specified time frame without waiving their rights will receive a penalty of **-10 points** on their subsequent applications.

What is the duration of the grant?

Students selected for grant-funded internship mobility programs will receive grant support for **a maximum of two months.**

ERASMUS+ BLENDED MOBILITY / BIP / BLENDED INTENSIVE PROGRAM

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Erasmus+ Blended Mobility?

Blended mobility is a type of mobility that combines physical mobility with a mandatory virtual component, fostering collaboration and teamwork. In this model, students participate in online classes while completing the process with a short period of physical mobility.

What is a Blended Intensive Program (BIP)?

BIPs are short, intensive training programs that utilize innovative teaching and learning methods, including online collaboration. Developed jointly by three higher education institutions from at least three different program countries, these programs promote interdisciplinary learning and new curriculum approaches.

Who can apply?

Full-time students enrolled in associate's, bachelor's, master's, or doctoral programs at our university are eligible to apply. Students in preparatory and scientific preparation programs, as well as distance learning students, are not eligible to participate in this activity.

What is the academic grade point average (GPA) requirement?

The minimum GPA requirements applied at our university are **2.20/4.00** for associate and undergraduate students, and **2.50/4.00** for master's and doctoral students.

What are the language proficiency requirements?

To be eligible for selection, a minimum score of 65 (B1 level) on our university's foreign language exam is required. If you have an existing TOEFL certificate (from the last 2 years) or a YDS/YÖKDİL (e-exams included) certificate (from the last 5 years), you can upload it to the application system.

When and how to apply?

Applications open every year in February. The entire process is conducted online only through TurnaPortal (<https://turnaportal.ua.gov.tr>) using e-Government login.

What is the duration of the mobility and the amount of ECTS credits awarded?

The physical mobility period should be **minimum 5 days and maximum 30 days**. The virtual component must be completed before or after the physical mobility, and **at least 3 ECTS** credits must be recognized as equivalent upon successful completion of the program.

What is the amount of the grant?

Duration of Activity	Grant Amount (program countries)
Until the 14th day of the activity	79 Euros per day
From the 15th to the 30th day of the activity	56 Euros per day

Is an Acceptance Letter mandatory?

It is not mandatory to submit it during the application process. However, candidates who upload their acceptance letter to the system before the application deadline will receive a **+10 point** advantage.

How can I find an internship placement?

Students can research internship placements themselves; companies, research institutes, laboratories, or higher education institutions are suitable options. However, EU institutions and agencies are not suitable for internships.

Is travel support available?

To help students with their travel expenses, the distance between the starting point and the location of the activity should be determined using the distance calculator provided by the European Commission (http://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/tools/distance_en.htm), and the travel grant should be calculated using the table below. The grant amount

Individual support grants are provided for travel time before and after the activity, up to a maximum of two days for travel days and a maximum of six days if green travel is used.

Is it possible to participate in Blended Mobility after graduation?

Yes, provided the application is submitted before graduation, the activity can be carried out within 12 months following graduation. However, since credit recognition is mandatory for BIP learning mobility, the physical activity must be completed before graduation.

What is the situation for students who have frozen their enrollment?

Students who have frozen their enrollment cannot participate in mobility programs during the suspension period; however, they can apply during the frozen period.

What are the plus and minus points in the evaluation?

The evaluation process is based on academic achievement (50%) and language proficiency (50%). Additional points are awarded for factors such as being a relative of a martyr/veteran (+15), disability (+10), or having an AFAD (Disaster and Emergency Management Presidency) assistance certificate (+10); however, a deduction of **-10 points** is applied if the recipient has previously received assistance at the same educational level.

What happens if I give up mobility?

Students who withdraw without notifying the authorities within the announced withdrawal period after being selected will have 10 points deducted from their next Erasmus application.

Is it possible to do an Erasmus program without a grant ("0" grant)?

Yes, in cases of budget constraints, students with sufficient selection scores can participate in activities without receiving a grant. These students have the same rights and responsibilities as students receiving grants.

ERASMUS+ SHORT-TERM DOCTORAL MOBILITY

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Erasmus+ PhD Short-Term Traineeship Mobility?

This program allows doctoral students enrolled in a higher education institution to undertake a short-term internship (5-30 days) abroad at a company, research institute, laboratory, or organization related to their academic field. It is designed to meet the learning needs of doctoral candidates and recent graduates (post-docs) and to create equal opportunities.

Who can apply?

- Those enrolled as full-time students in a doctoral program within our university,
- Those with an academic GPA of at least **2.50 / 4.00**,
- Applicants must achieve a **minimum B1 level (65 points)** on the language exam administered by our university.

Note: Students enrolled in distance learning programs are not eligible for this activity.

When and how to apply?

Applications open every year in February. The entire process is conducted online only through TurnaPortal (<https://turnaportal.ua.gov.tr>) using e-Government login.

What is the duration of the mobility period?

The physical duration of short-term doctoral mobility can be a **minimum of 5 days and a maximum of 30 days**. Students who fail to complete the minimum 5-day period without a compelling reason will have their activity deemed invalid and will not receive grant payments.

How do you find an internship placement?

Students are responsible for finding their own internship institutions. The institution can be a company, research institute, laboratory, or higher education institution. However, European Union institutions and agencies are not suitable for internships.

Is an Acceptance Letter mandatory?

Submitting an acceptance letter is not mandatory during the application process, however, candidates who upload their acceptance letters to the application system may receive additional points during the selection phase, in accordance with the National Agency's criteria. Selected candidates must submit their acceptance letters by the deadline specified in the announced schedule.

What are the financial support (grant) rates?

Grant amounts are determined on a daily basis:

Duration of Activity	Grant Amount (Country Associated with the Programme)
Until the 14th day of the activity	79 Euros per day
From the 15th to the 30th day of the activity	56 Euros per day

- *Important Note: Our institution provides grant support for short-term mobility programs for a maximum of 14 days, subject to budget limitations.*

Is travel support provided?

Yes, travel assistance is paid in an amount determined by the European Commission's distance calculator, depending on the distance to be traveled.

What is "Green Travel" support?

Students who complete more than half of their entire trip using a low-carbon mode of transport, such as buses, trains, or shared cars, may receive a one-time additional grant and up to 4 days' worth of extra travel allowance.

Is it possible to do Erasmus without a grant?

Yes. Students who have a sufficient selection score but cannot be placed on the grant waiting list due to budget constraints can participate in the program as "0" grant (self-funded) Erasmus students.

Is it possible to do a postdoctoral (post-doctoral) internship?

Yes. PhD students can complete short-term internships within 12 months (including the internship period) following their graduation, provided they apply in their final year.

How are applications scored?

The selection score is calculated by taking 50% of the academic grade point average and 50% of the foreign language score. For other additional points and deduction criteria (previous eligibility, waiver period, etc.), **the current National Agency Application Handbook rules** apply.

Is travel support available?

To help students with their travel expenses, the distance between the starting point and the location of the activity should be determined using the distance calculator provided by the European Commission (http://ec.europa.eu/programmes/erasmus-plus/tools/distance_en.htm), and the travel grant should be calculated using the table below. The grant amount corresponding to the kilometer value obtained from the distance calculator is the round-trip amount in the table below, and this amount should not be multiplied by two.

How can internship activities be academically recognized?

The internship period a student spends abroad is academically recognized by our university. This recognition is done through the **Learning Agreement** for Traineeship and the inclusion of the successfully completed activity in the transcript or in the Diploma Supplement.

What happens if I give up mobility?

Students who withdraw from the program without notifying the relevant authorities within the announced withdrawal periods after being selected will have points deducted from their next Erasmus application.
