WHO IS AZIZ SANCAR?



Aziz Sancar is the current popular name in the field of academic sciences. He is an Istanbul University graduate Turkish scientist who won 2015 the Nobel Chemistry prize in the branch of biochemistry and DNA repair. He is the second Turkish citizen who has won the Nobel Prize but he is the first Turkish citizen who has won it in the field of science.

He was born on 8th September and grew up in Mardin. His parents were farmers. His father had eight children and Aziz Sancar is the seventh son in the family. His father and mother were illiterate; however Aziz Sancar knew the importance of education so he was a successful student in high school.

He started at Istanbul University in 1963 and graduated in 1969.He worked two years for a cottage hospital and then he went to Dallas to focus on molecular biology.

He got married to a lecturer-Gwen Boles Sancar and later on they established Aziz & Gwen Sancar foundation together to help Turkish students in America This

# THE MYSTERY OF THE LOST CITY OF REFERENCE DE CITY OF REFERENCE

#### Is it really somewhere around us waiting to be discovered?

The word "Atlantis"! It sounds mystic, right? What does this word remind you of? An island? Or a place that you have been before. Atlantis is an island. Once, Plato mentions it in one of his books, Timeous. Moreover, Atlantis is the major subject of a TV series as well. Nobody knows where it is or what happened to the people who lived in this lost city. Though there are contradictions about the definite location of the lost city. Atlantis archaeologists are still investigating where it could be. As a result of findings, some of them assert that the city is in the seaside off Spain, whereas others say it's one of the Greek islands. However, the questions that come to mind are 'Is it fact or fiction? What is the truth? If it's fact, where is it? What happened to the people who lived there? Are there any traces of the history of that civilization? Or, is it just wasting time to struggle to find out the answers to these questions for centuries? Here are some clues to evaluate the authenticity of the Lost City of Atlantis.

First of all, 'Timeous', which is one of Plato's books, is the hardest one to understand and consists of Plato's dialogues about speculations on the nature of the physical world and human beings. The book also indicates how the best government should be. At this point, Atlantis is given as an ideal example for the best government in the book. According to the book, some civilizations such as ancient Egypt and Aztec are known as Atlantis. These civilizations tried to improve themselves in every subject such as technology, science, education etc. Again, according to the book, people in Atlantis think that it is inside of the pillars of Heracles for Greek people and, at that time, this powerful civilization wanted to dominate the world. Because of an unexplained reason, Atlantis Island

had natural disasters and it disappeared with the people on it in a day. Here is a paragraph that is taken from

Timeous as asserted by Plato:

"Really old scriptures says that, once upon a time, your country destroyed a huge government which attacks cheekily Europe and Asia and comes beyond the Atlantic Ocean. In that time, this huge sea can be passed because there was an island in front of the pillars which you call the Pillars of Heracles. This island was bigger than Asia and Libya. Monarchs set the sovereignty in the whole of Atlantis Island and the other islands. One day, this government gathered all their forces and wanted to conquer your lands, our lands and other lands. Then Solon showed his power and beat them. After that, terrible earthquakes and floods happened. One day, on a nasty night, suddenly all of your warriors got buried. In the same way, Atlantis island disappeared into the sea" (Plato, 360 BC, 24-25)

In addition to Plato's claim, at the same time there is a famous British TV series- Atlantis- which is inspired from Greek mythology and features the lost city Atlantis. There is a main character whose name is Jason. The TV series begins with who the father was, and he gets on a submarine and dives into the ocean. Then he sees a White light and the blackout. When he wakes up, he is on a shore that belongs to the Kingdom of Atlantis. He meets with two new friends who will help him throughout his adventures. On TV, we can see lots of different characters like Medusa, Pisagor and Hercules and the way to their daily lives, what they do in their free time, what they eat, what they believe, their religions, traditions, celebrations and so on. For instance, in the first episode, focusing on their traditions, in order to live in the city of Atlantis in peace, every year people have to sacrifice seven young girls and seven young boys for Minotor. They say that once upon a time, Minotor was a man- a

human being, however, when he revolted against the Gods, they punished him by turning him into a half man - half monster. When the sacrifice day comes, all Atlantis people come to the palace. They take a stone from the mouth of a bull sculpture. If they take a white stone, then they will not be sacrificed. But, if they take a black stone, they are taken to the cage of the Minotor without any weapons. And, usually they are feloniously killed by Minotor. However, the main character Jason kills the Minotor and the Minotor becomes a man. In his last breath, he says that Jason is an important person and he dies. Of course it is based on history and we do not know whether it is true or not. Though the director of the series creates the story a bit differently, it gives us lots of clues and information about Atlantis and its citizens.

Moreover, many archaeologists, scientists and universities search for the lost city of Atlantis so that they can prove the location of the city. And, of course, they have similar question in their minds; where could it be? The photos of different places on the earth are taken from space by satellites and investigated. Thus, they find a few places where the lost city Atlantis could be. A couple of sources say that Atlantis could be in the South of Spain according to the satellite photos. Another source says that Atlantis could be in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean. Some people say the word Atlantic come from Atlantis. A couple of investigations have been done under the sea around the Bermudan Devil Triangle and researchers have found a submerged city near the coast of Cuba. The submerged city has roads, tunnels, pyramids and different structures. Then with more enthusiasm they are still exploring to solve the mystery of Atlantis. However, whatever the claims are, I think Atlantis is still worth thinking and searching about to lift the veil of mystery.

t the Exposition Universelle in 1889 the Eiffel Tower was originally built to impress the tourists by having an international exhibition. The aim was to provide an impressive element to the Paris

exhibition in 1889 by Gustave Eiffel on the first floor of the tower show a short film that can be viewed. The purpose of the tower does not have the icon as can also be seen there. However, it was the first monument in Paris at 324 meters height. Totally 18,038 pieces of steel were used in the construction of the tower. Some 2.5 million parts for the unification of the riveting process were required. Each tower needs to be painted every 5-7 years using 50 tonnes of paint. More than 850 tonnes in total until today has been used in paint. Held for the first time in 1985, the lighting of the tower with 352 sodium vellow-orange lamps takes place.

Released in 2001,"MEMENTO", this movie was considered by numerous critics to be one of the best films of the 2000s.

"INSOMNIA" is a Norwegian film and in 2002, he made a new version of it starring Academy Award winners Al Pacino and Robin Williams.

When they adapted the "BATMAN" movie, it was 2005 and it is called "BATMAN BEGINS". This movie, which is about his childhood comic book hero was a great hit and received very good reviews from critics.

The film "PRESTIGE" was shot in 2006 and it tells the story of two rival illusionists. It got a lot of attention around the world.

Then, in 2008, he shot "THE DARK KNIGHT" movie from the sequel

"BATMAN BEGINS". It became one of the best movies of all time and it had great success.

When the film "INCEPTION" was made in 2010, starring Leonardo Di Caprio and Tom Hardy, it hit the first 5 in IMDB.

In 2012, when "THE DARK KNIGHT RISES" movie was released as the last film in the series, it was successful both critically and financially. In the first week of its release, it managed to hit the first 20 in IMDB. Also, the film was among the most viewed films, reaching more than one billion views.

In 2014, he shot the movie "INTERSTELLAR" and this film was described as a masterpiece. The film is about an interstellar journey by a group of explorers after they discovered a new wormhole.

Some of the common features of these movies are flashbacks and flash-forwards. blackmailing innocent people, and the characters' missing childhood. He also uses a lot of special effects. In 2017, he is expected to release another film which is still untitled. However, we are sure that it's going to be another great success.

especially about the destruction of L nature, you probably know the "Yeşil Yol Project". But for those who do not, I will explain briefly. This project includes six cities (Ordu, Trabzon, Rize, Giresun, Artvin, Gümüşhane) and the purpose of this project is basically building asphalt roads to provide connection between plateaus. In this respect, it looks quite harmless, even beneficial for the developing eco-tourism in the Eastern Black Sea. However, the truth is totally different.

As you know "Hydroelectric Power Plants" have already exterminated some animal and plant species in Turkey, but authorities still insist that we need more energy and we have to supply it from "HPP" instead of solar panels, wind powers or biomass energy. uhammad Ali was born in Kentucky Louisville in 1942. His name was Cassius Marcellus Clay Jr. before he became a Muslim. When he was riding a bicycle with his brother, their bicycle was stolen and they started to cry. Right after, they saw a man in front of the boxing centre. They said, 'our bicycles were stolen, what can we do? " The man replied, "Enter the boxing centre, there is a policeman. You should tell him". They went inside and Muhammad Ali saw boxing for the first time. He was twelve years old. So the legend of Muhammad Ali was born.

He started boxing as an amateur and in 1960, at the age of 18 years old, participated in the Rome Olympics. Then young Cassius won the Olympic Championship. After that, Cassius came back to his country and went to a restaurant for dinner. Soon after, the owner of the restaurant came to his table and said "you are a black; you cannot eat anything here. Get out! ". Cassius said, "but I am an Olympic Champion". "I don't care, you are black. Black people cannot come here , said the man. Cassius left the restaurant and went home. He was so angry that he took his Olympic medal and threw it into the river.

#### FIRST WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

When he was twenty-two years old, he wanted to be the Heavyweight Champion of the world, but he needed to beat Sonny Liston for that and it was not easy because Sonny Liston was very strong and he was the World Champion, but Clay didn't care. Finally, he beat Sonny Liston and became the Heavyweight Champion of the World. "I've shaken up the world!", he shouted in the ring.

HE IS NOT MUHAMMAD ALI ANYMORE When he became the World Champion everyone knew him. He converted to Islam and changed his name to Muhammad Ali. So began a difficult time for him. He introduced Islam to the people, but they didn't like that. The American government didn't like it either and they exiled him. At the same time there was a war between America and Vietnam. They called him to the draft to be a soldier. "I will not go to war and I will not kill anyone", said Mohammad. Then he was sentenced to serve five years in prison and pay ten thousand dollars. They also took his championship belt back. He couldn't fight, and he couldn't earn a living anymore. However, he introduced Islam at universities and earned money that way.

#### SECOND WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

Three years later, he won his case in a court of law and returned to boxing. He wanted to be a champion again, but it was not easy because he hadn't fought for three years. He lost two fights and everyone thought his career had ended. He needed to beat George Foreman to be champion again. George Foreman was very young and much stronger than Muhammad Ali and had won all his fights.

Eventually, they fought in Zaire in 1974 and Muhammad beat him and became the Champion of the World again.

#### THIRD WORLD CHAMPION

Four years later in 1978 when he was thirty-six years old, he beat Leon Spinks and became the Champion of the World again. Leon Spinks was eleven years younger than Muhammad Ali, but it didn't matter because he was a legend. Ali retired from boxing in 1980.

#### PARKINSON'S DISEASE

Muhammed Ali developed Parkinson's disease in 1980. He also continued to introduce Islam after he retired from boxing. He is seventy-there years old now and lives in Arizona. Everyone respects him around the world and now he is The Greatest Fighter of All Time. God bless you CHAMP!!!

# BACKSTAGE with ILYAS SALMAN

n our country; most people know and recall Mr.Salman as his famous characters, Banker Bilo, Bilo Aga and Çiçek Abbas. He has acted in many memorable films that we shall never forget. Even when we remember one of his characters, a big smile appears on our faces. Ilyas Salman, who is a man of many abilities, is a very famous Turkish actor as well as a writer and film director. Now, he is in his sixties and has a successful acting career in the Turkish movie sector and, of course, through his films, has been enshrined in our memories. In this case, it was impossible for me to wait any longer, then suddenly, I took my camera and microphone to speak to Mr.Salman about his acting career, personality, fears and so on. For us, he answered all of my questions with his poetic expression and intimacy to satisfy our curiosity. For this opportunity, I really thank him for his hospitality and sincerity.

Here are some unknown aspects of Mr. Salman:

How would you describe your personality?

In one sentence, shortly, I can say that I am a man who feels very sad even if I see a dead cat or someone in trouble around me. I have a very compassionate and sensual character.

You have never celebrated your birthday, why?

I do not celebrate my birthday because my birth date is unclear. So, I do not know when exactly I was born. However, if I wanted to celebrate my birthday, I would celebrate it on May 1 as the date symbolizes Labour Day.

How did you start acting? What was the first play you took and what was the role? I played in a drama when I was in elementary school. It was my first acting experience. The name of the play was "Orphan Mehmet". I got the lead role in the play. Then, I decided to become an actor as I liked my performance very much in that play. I decided to go Ankara, but I was a penniless young boy. Then, I had an idea, in order to go to Ankara to make real my dream, I stole some money from my father's pocket. Then, secretly, I went to Ankara to attend the conservatory exam. As a result, Although, I did not get the lead role in that film, it was my first professional acting experience which contributed to me a lot.

Which personal qualities must someone have so as to become a successful actor or actress?

I do not deny the talent and self-confidence are necessary. Ability and self-confidence are the quarter part of this work. I do not deny that education within this framework is another quarter part of acting. The last half of it is observation. So, anyone who would like to be a successful performer should consider it very carefully. As acting consists of learning about life itself, candidates should have keen observation skills to analyse social events and behaviours in the society.

What are your three favorite films in which you played?

Talihli Amele, Sarı Mercedes, Çirkinlerde Sever. I was impressed a lot by the stories of those films because, I love films which reflect the authentic problems and realities of our society.

As far as I know you are not only an actor but also a writer. Could you, please tell us about your literary works?

In fact, I wrote three books, which are 'Kırmızı Beyaz', 'Hem Sosyalistim Hem de Kemalist', and 'Hasretim Sansürlüdür'. Moreover, I sometimes write poems. I always say that 'Society does not benefit from a human who doesn't know anything about love, poetry and fight'.

Do you have a favourite writer from the world of literature, especially from British and American literature?

I have loved reading books since my childhood. I like reading Charles Dicken's novels from English literature. He wrote true stories about human life and their condition in the society.

He was a good observer and a perfect social critic. He created very effective and successful characters in his stories. Also, I like the Bronte sisters' books. I think that they have an original writing style and are able to reflect women's social and political conditions in their time. I read Dostoyevsky from Russian Literature. In Turkish literature, Yaşar Kemal, Orhan Kemal and Nazım Hikmet are my favorite writers. I love those writers because all of them wrote about society and real conflicts in it.

Is there anything you regret in your life? Are you afraid of death?

I wish for immortality. I wish I could be immortal because I am afraid of dying one day. Because, when I die, I won't be able to films again. I won't be able to produce new things. Everything in this life ends for me with death. I do not want to die.

How does the death of valuable actors, one after the other, in Turkish cinema affect you?

I feel very sad. Levent Kırca, who was a famous playwright, comedian, performer and social critic, died. Memduh Un, who was a famous film director and a critic, also died. They were major losses for our society and sector because it's very hard to grow new talents. The timing was just a coincidence. I will not die. I will stay here a bit more  $\mathbf{\mathcal{D}}$  (laughs). I do not die easily.

Are you afraid of being forgotten? I am honoured to be famous. I believe that I have done good things for people during my life. I'd be very sorry if people forgot me. All artists are afraid of being forgotten.

Do you have anything you wish to share with my schoolmates?

Of course, YES! Turkish society needs educated, cultured, knowledgeable and smart youth. You should read, think and criticize. We are in a period in which the ability to thin and criticize have been lost. We need artists, thinkers and critics for the development of society. I believe that we have great artists, thinkers and critics among Turkish youth. The most important advice I would give to you and your schoolmates is not to strive to be someone other than who you are. Just be yourself, naturally. I wish you all beautiful lives.

As you can guess, although, we had a very short time for the interview, he answered all the questions honestly. He has a beautiful page full of colours and experiences in the history of Turkish cinema. People of all generations fondly watch his films again and again. Maybe, I cannot find the answer to immortality, but I believe that I have reminded you of Ilyas Salman with this interview.

It means users will be able to change their components wherever and whenever they want. They will exchange phone components and try new things. Ifat Ilgaz wrote many masterpieces such as, Hababam Sinifi and Karartma Geceleri, and his son Aydın Ilgaz was our guest.

In this interview, we got all the answers to our questions. He explained what he and his father had been through, his education, life in the USA and the success of his book. We also talked about literature and his daily life.

#### 1.You studied in America. How was your life in america?

Actually, I got a scholarship to Michigan University, but in those years, I couldn't get a passport because I'm Rıfat Ilgaz's son. After that, we made a request to Can Yücel's father. He was an old friend, but again I couldn't have it. His help wasn't enough. Then someone in the basketball federation did me a favour and I got the passport, thanks to him. Then I couldn't obtain a visa. So, I got a tourist visa and paid 54 dollars. I lived there for 7 years. I studied and worked at the university. My study period took a look time because I only took a few lessons. It was hard.

#### 2. What was the breaking point of your life?

Suddenly, I was alone. I knew the language, but it wasn't enough to live in America. I had to improve myself, so the school arranged an American student to help me with English. He taught me many things about how to live in America. Incidentally, I became Indian (another story by the way). I travelled from state to state and then beyond my knowledge, my visa was extended. I didn't know. Some unpleasant things like this happened.

### 3. You had a hard time as a child. For example, your father was in custody. Bad things happened like this. So how did you feel about those days?

People always thought I was the guilty one. I was treated like a second-class citizen. My mother was a teacher in the high school. She got divorced from my father because of their political views. At the same time, they accused my father because his book was red and the name 'Devrim' was the last name of an honored theatre player, İhsan Devrim. They were traumatic events. Then, my father published a weekly book called 'Hababam Sınıfı'. He didn't use his name on the book because he didn't want anything unexpected and terrible to happen. Everthing changed over time. In my opinion, that also remained an historical event.

#### 4. What are the factors of an effective, inspiring novel? What kind of things make a novel a masterpiece?

If we look at a succesful novel, we can see that it is a0bout real life. For example, a girl isn't 11 years old, yet she wants to read a 'love story'. There is not just one theme in a novel. There should be everything in a novel. Maybe both love and war. There should be no limit. 5. All Rıfat Ilgaz' Works are wonderful, but still which one has the most effect on you?

'Karartma Geceleri' and 'Sarı Yazma'. These are the novels which he wrote about his real life. I always say that Rıfat ilgaz's books are not novels, they are memories. My father used to say: "I am a socialist realist; why would I make my novel something surreal?"

#### 6. What do you think about 'Hababam Sınıfı' as a movie? Lousy, my father couldn't watch it. It was not art at all; it was a commercial business. The movie was not the same as the novel. In the movie 'Damat Ferit' brings a baby and the janitor is taking care of the baby. There is no such thing in History, especially in high school. In both movies, Rıfat Ilgaz's name was not even mentioned. The word "Cow" normally refers to nerd students, but in the movie it was used as stupid, and that is

really sad.

7. What do you think of today's literature? The only thing matters is popularity now. Publishers see books as a trade good, but still these books come and go. Today, we have Rifat Ilgaz, Sabahattin Ali and Orhan Kemal, etc. They are real artists. I believe real artists are a step ahead and they lead the society.

8. Thank you for answer to my questions. You are a wonderful person. We all have respect for you. Is there anything else you'd like to add? Literature is a part of our life. 'Alişim' is my father's poem. If you read it, you will understand what I mean. Social realism is just like this. Actually, it's my pleasure because talking with young people makes me happy. My father also didn't like to talk with old people anyway. (laughter) Young people make me feel vivacious. Have a safe life all of you.





If you hear the words "law and justice" for the first time, you can think they sound the same but law and justice are different from each other just like bad and good. Let me explain with an example: There was a football match and a little child jumped into the field to touch his favourite football player for the first time. Suddenly, an "excellent at his job" 'security guy jumped on the little child and stopped him. However, this favourite football player saw what had happened, went and embraced him and –eventually- the little boy reached his target. What is it to do with law and justice, right? The difference between law and justice stands out in this example, indeed. If people agree with laws, the little child has to be punished. three points so none of them overcomes the other.

# The English of Football

Football, which is the most popular sport in today's world, has been played since the 19th century in over 200 countries and by over 250 million people.

Football is played between 2 groups of 11 players as a team sport on a rectangular field which is made from natural or synthetic grass. There are goals in the middle of each of the short lines of this big rectangle. The main purpose of the players is to put the ball into the opponent's goal using certain parts of their bodies, especially the feet. The exception of the game is that players named goalkeepers are able to touch the ball with hands in the small part of the field named the penalty area. If the ball gets out of the field from the long lines of the court, the opponent team takes the ball from the spot where ball went out, and does a "THROW IN". If the ball goes out from the short corners, the opponent team takes ball possession from the corners, which is called a "CORNER". Total game time is 90 minutes, which is divided into two 45-minute-time periods and whoever scores more than the other will be the winner. At the end of the 90 minutes, if the scores are the same, it's called a 'draw'. For example, Fenerbahce and Galatasaray drew 2-2 in 2012.

I think, it is time to take strong-minded steps to overcome the problem as a nation, step by step, so as to bring up more qualified foot-

ballers. Thanks to our steps, is it not possible to win some more important titles and victories thanks to our own national Ronaldos and Messies? Why not?

### From A Grocer To The Literary Genius



In our life, we, sometimes, can encounter with many people who have, notably, very interesting life and background as they have very different experiences from one another. However, very few of them could be genius as a result of their intellectual profundity as they endeavor during their life time by not giving up despite all difficulties in their lives. Here is one of those intellectuals who is very famous in Russian literature and known with his popular stories and plays by millions around the World; Anton Chekhov.

When Anton Chekov was a small boy, he worked in his father's shop as a grocer for years. His father was a very religious man, which is why he sang in church choir for a long time, but he did not want to do it. He lived in Taganrog until he was sixteen it was when he decided to move to Moscow. Then he started to study medicine, meanwhile, he began writing stories and essays. His childhood was very arduous, so he deliberately tried to depict it in his masterpieces. Therefore,

in his stories, children were usually shown as poor, unhappy and mournful. Maybe for this reason, critics always say that Chekhov was an unhappy child that's why he tends to use his miserable childhood experiences in his stories. He graduated as a doctor from the university in 1884. And, for a long time, he was the economic mainstay for his family. Poverty was hard, and Chekhov always wanted to live in prosperity and good conditions to live like a real human being and write his masterpieces in good conditions. He was both working and studying. However, although he had short time, he was reading everyday too. He had a huge admiration for Tolstoy and the way he wrote. He took Tolstoy as a model for himself. He was the first representative of modern Russian literature in the late nineteenth century. At that time as the whole power was in the Tsar's hands he and other writers were in trouble as they were not permitted to write. However, despite the pressure coming from the Tsar on authors, he did never give up on his writings. In the meantime, he achieved

# Do you like Star Wars: The Porce Awakens?

The Star Wars SAGA has been through almost four decades. In this period, we have seen seven movies with lots of animation series, books and comics. The first movie of Star Wars was A New Hope, which was released in 1977. It was the fourth movie of the sequel. This was the first of its kind and was a revolutionary change in Hollywood because the original prequel started with the fourth movie and ended up with the sixth movie. After that, a new trilogy was released between 1999 and 2005. This trilogy has told us about the 30 years prior to A New Hope. There are not many fans in Turkey, but worldwide, it has a huge number of fan clubs and especially in the USA, which is the homeland of this fantastic universe. The current story of this epic journey is The Force Awakens. On December 18, 2015, a new era started with The Force Awakens. I want to ask a real question: "Do you actually like this copycat of The New Hope or not?" First of all, this review includes little spoilers for The Force Awakens, keep ready for it. In 2012 Lucasfilm, who shot the Star Wars SAGA, was sold to Disney for 4.05 billion dollars. I think,

this kind of price is so funny for Star Wars universe because according to Bloomberg's future revenue, the Star Wars brand is worth at least 17 billion dollars. And, Bloomberg's foresights for The Force Awakens' income will be nearly 6 billion dollars, including products.

George Lucas, who created this amazing universe and shot, explained why he sold his own brand, "Star Wars". He basically said he was very sorry to do it, but he had to because, from the beginning to the end, he just shot this movie to show a new perspective to viewers. He didn't like having to use other companies to finance Star Wars. For this reason, he sold it. When you consider George Lucas's speech's, I think he did what he had to do. In the end, there is no way to prevent the fu-ture impact on Star Wars by Disney. Secondly, I had doubts about the new movie back then. I was sure that The Force Awakens would be a bad influence on me before I went to movie because all the Disney movies I had ever watched were so childish and restricted that I was scared this movie's magic was going to fly away. However, in the end I had to try to keep myself

to build a good and long lasting friendship with Leo Tolstoy and Maksim Gorki. Due to the fact that his writings included political critiques, some of his articles, stories and plays were banned. At that time, aristocrats had exaggerated and extremely comfortable life. And poor people lived wretchedly. Chekhov didn't abstain and reveal all those inequalities, in the society where he lived, in his masterpieces. Due to the prohibitions for his performances he and his friends Konstantin Stanislavsky- a famous Russian actor and theatre director- and Nemirovich-Dancenko- a famous Russian theatre director and playwrightestablished the New Moscow Art Theater together. In this theatre, Chekhov's dramas were shown again and again and people were fond of them. Some of Chekhov's works are (1887) Ivanov, (1889) the Wood Demon, (1896) the Seagul, (1899) Uncle Vanya, (1901) Three Sisters, and (1904) The Cherry Orchard. As a result of his efforts and unforgettable masterpieces, Russian theater refreshed between the years 1895-1904.

Chekhov blazed in Russian theater with his play named Seagull. He told about life's contradictions and daily life's pains in Seagull- 1896.

himself, and has always achieved keeping his inner freedom. He never cared expectations of the others, especially, for those who were rude. Within this simplicity, he also liked the things which were simple, real and intimate; he also taught the others the simplicity he had by his own way."

Chekov lived in Yalta (Kirim) for a long time, and got married with Olga Knipper. In 1904, "The Cherry Orchard" was performed in Moscow which was one of his best work. Meanwhile, Chekhov's health deteriorated, and he went to Germany- Badenwiller- with his wife. In Badenwiller, as a result of the deterioration of his health condition, he could not stand more and he passed away in the same year. After his death- forty years later-, all the literary works of Anton Chekhov, were published in 20 volumes. These works include thousands of letters, many stories and plays of Chekhov. Though many years passed after his death, even today, his works continue to inspire not only all literature readers but also writers.

"You have lost your reason and taken

"Presumably, the ones who knew Anton Chekhov felt the way that they would be more simple and true, or being himself... it was within the dignity that Chekhov lived his life; he succeeded to be

In its first years, people were using it only for communication. First phones were very big and heavy; moreover, their sound quality was terrible and they did not even have buttons on them. As years went by, phones changed as people's needs changed. They had buttons, they got smaller and became more modern. And, finalaly, people had an idea like carrying phones with them to stay in communication with each other. As a result, mobile phones were invented in 1970s.

With the invention of mobile phones, we got rid of the house phones that we could use them only when we were at home. They have become personal computers which we could use for almost all activities that we could do with a computer. Then, manufacturers started to use touchscreens on phones. As a result of the development of the screens, we needed bigger screens, and the buttons on the phones have been removed.

Manufacturers wanted to make use of the opportunity by extending mobile phone screens. They have been producing the screens with bigger resolution and better color accuracy for mobile phones. Firstly, it started with HD, then Full HD, 2K and, finally, 4K. It sounds fantastic at first, I admit it, but, then I started to question whether extremely high resolutions are necessary for 5 or 6 inch screens or not. I do not think so, and here are some reasons why I find it redundant.

First of all, let's start with the most important aspects of screens; resolution. The tiniest units of the screens are called pixels. The resolution indicates the number of pixels that the screens have. For example, let's talk about the most known resolution; 1080p, which is commonly known as Full HD. 1080p resolution means 1920x1080 (1920 horizontal, 1080 vertical pixels) pixels and that means 2.073.600 pixels in one screen. Amazing!

Also, there is one more thing that I should mention; the PPI (Pixel Per Inch). PPI is a term that states the number of pixels which exist in per inch. The bigger the resolution, the bigger PPI ratio there will be. Manufacturers always promote how much PPI ratio their phones have. But, there is one question about it: how much PPI can a human eye see? According to some sources, an average human eye can see approximately 400 PPI from a normal distance. The PPI ratio of a 5" 1080p screen is 441 PPI. See? We have already reached the ideal ratio with Full HD resolution. But, Sony, one of the most famous electronic manufacturers, has produced a new phone with 5.5" 4K resolution screen. Do you know what that means? 2160 x 3840 pixels, which means 8.294.400 pixels! And, that means 801 PPI! Can you believe it? They have doubled the ideal PPI that a human eye can see. So, why do they produce screens with such high pixel densities despite the fact that we cannot see the difference? I think, it is about their marketing strategy. Companies make people believe that the higher PPI, the higher screen quality. But I think, the screens bigger than 1080p on phones are useless.

Another matter is the cost of such productions. Screens are the most expensive components that phones have. As the resolutions get bigger, the production process gets more difficult and the cost of producing the screens gets higher. You know what happens; when the cost of the screens increases, the phones' prices increase. As you can remember, we have mentioned the maximum PPI ratio that a human eye can see. So, if we cannot see PPIs higher than 400 PPI, do we need to pay more for something that we cannot see? What is the point of having a phone with 4K screen if we cannot spot the difference

from the Full HD?

Furthermore, if we ask people which of the features of mobile phones they would want to be improved most, I am sure most of them would say, "the battery". Because it is the most important thing for most users. Our mobile phone usage time depends on the life of the battery in it. Do you know which component consumes the battery most? Of course, the screen! In early days, we were able to use our mobile phones for days without charging. But as the phones are getting smarter, their screens are getting bigger. Now, we have phones that are almost completely made of screen. Almost, every person who has a smartphone charges their phones every day. Some of their batteries die even before we get home. In fact, the screen gets controlled by the GPU (Graphic Processing Unit) and CPU (Central Processing Unit) of the phone. As the resolution gets higher, the GPU and CPU work more to control it. As a result of that, the components need more power and battery gets drained faster. And again, we pay more for a screen which causes our batteries get drained faster. To sum up, the higher numbers like high

To sum up, the higher numbers like high resolution, lots of CPU cores or MHz (the speed of CPU) do not always mean better results. As I said before, we cannot spot the difference between a Full HD and 4K screen. Also, the screens with higher resolutions cost more and drain our batteries faster. According to these statements, we pay more for something that we do not even need. Within this scope, I think, companies make us throw our money to street. As conscious consumers, it is a good idea to think twice before buying a mobile phone.

#### THE HUMANITARIAN SITUATION IN THE NORTH COUNTRYSIDE IN HOMS

The main problem which makes a challenge to any local or global effects to provide humanitarian relief services is the siege.

The countryside of Homs has been under siege for four years, by a number of pro regime villages and many of barriers. The regime uses the siege as a weapon to subjugate the people in the besieged areas.

To send the necessary materials to the besieged areas like food, medicine and fuel for one of two ways:

1- By getting help from the areas of militias, the regime barriers, and through limited brokers, which open the door to monopoly and high prices;

2- By using the dangerous Military roads and the rugged areas, if we are going to divide the topic into two parts, starting with food, water, health, education, fuel and safety.

Then we will talk in each part about facts, its difficulties, the challenges, and the future hope and how to get it. The rural areas are composed of large agricultural land and that makes them capable of self-sufficiency in theory. This area is dependent on their feeding on a product of agricultural and animal crops by 20% and they depend on what is taken from the raw materials through the methods mentioned above.

However, there are some obstacles to make the best use of the potential of rural Homs, one of which is that a large part of agricultural area is outside the town. This makes it difficult for the people to use this area as it's not safe these days. I hope the unstable situation and war in Homs will end soon and the people will get back to their normal life to rebuild Homs.

### how to use a white eye pencil

Today I am going to tell you how to use a white eye pencil practically and where to use it. There are many uses of a white eye pencil.

1) If you apply the white eye pencil to your upper lip line triangle and along your lower lip line, your lips will seem fuller than normal.

2) Your nose will be more upright than normal when you apply it on the tip of your nose.
3) If your eyes are too close to each other, apply it to your mid-brow to separate them.
4) Another technique is to apply it under your brow.

With that method, your brows will be more upright than normal.

5) When you apply the pencil to the inner corners of your eyes, your eyes will be brighter and will seem bigger as well.

6) The eyes will seem rounder if you apply the pencil to the mid eyelid.

7) Apply it to the inside of your eyes to erase the redness in the eyes or make your eyes brighter.
8) You can apply it under foundation to erase lines and pits on the face.

# Turkey's Only **Underwater Museum**

The first underwater museum of Turkey and coincidentally Europe first underwater museum has officially been opened to the public by Istanbul & Marmara, Aegean, Mediterranean and Blacksea Regions Chambers of Shipping (IMEAK) in Antalya in October 2015. The museum has been designed like the world famous underwater museum of Caribbean Sea of Mexico. It boasts 110 different kinds of sculptures representing the civilizations of Anatolia which are exhibited in the museum. The aim of this project is to increase the popularity of the region with several historical and cultural themes ranging from 'Temple of Poseidon' to 'Whirling Dervishes', 'Camel Trains', 'Flowers Gardens' and 'Turkish War of Independence'. The sculptures are made of materials which are environ-

mentally friendly and that do not damage marine life. The sculptures of the museum are lowered into the sea by professional divers to a depth of between 11-24 meters deep. The museum is located 1.5 miles away from Side. The sculptures range between 1-6 meters in height and weigh up to 5 tonnes. The importance of Turkey's national and historical values is emphasized in this project. The Chairman of IMEAK's Antalya Branch, Bekir Inanç Kendiroğlu, said, "We have realized a wonderful project. The world's biggest underwater museum is in Cancun, Mexico. There are 3 million tourists in the world who are actively involved in diving tourism. The museum has five main themes. This year 30.000 people visited the museum. Our first goal is to draw 500.000 people annually and then increase it to 1 million. There is

a real increase in the underwater tourism. We believe that an extremely worthy financial return can be received from this sector". Kendiroğlu also adds, We are planning on making improvements to diving tourism and to open underwater museums in districts of Antalya such as Kemer, Alanya and others in the coming years." In addition, diving tourism has increased by 30 percent in Side since the formation of various schools. Also Germany, the Netherlands and Belgium have started supporting the museum, diving tourism and the need for diving schools. Everyone with a diving certificate can dive in the area of the museum for free. Diving tourists have mostly been choosing to go to Mexico, Egypt, New Zealand and India. Now, it is Turkey's turn!
